comprehensive assistance

We **provide** food assistance for those families who cannot afford the basic food supplies and provide them with counseling and guidance; we ensure vulnerable families have a place to live by providing subsidies for rent and utilities; we improve the life quality of our seniors by providing them food and medicines, home care and developing programs for social integration; and we develop a children's health care program, which includes nutrition assistance and cultural initiatives for children and adolescents.

We **aim** to keep children and young people in school and provide job training and guidance for youths and adults.

We **distribute** free medicines to patients suffering from chronic diseases across the country as well as to NGOs and hospitals, and develop specific campaigns to prevent illness.

we **contribute** to circular economy by welcoming all kinds of donations that are later marketed to raise funds for the Foundation's Social Programs.




we **foster** sustainability, social inclusion, and affordable quality products with Argentina's first online charitable store for refurbished appliances.

Institutional

Timeline and development

1991-1996 - Foundation stage

A group of well-known leaders of the Argentine community and from AMIA created Fundación Tzedaká to promote and encourage the philanthropic contributions destined to provide and answer to the growing social needs.

1997-1999 - New approach to the social aspect within the community

The growth of poverty forced us to implement a new system of social assistance, based in te interaction between the work of professionals and volunteers together with the creation of alliances with different institutions of the community.

2000-2004 - Consolidation and diversification of programs

The TZEDAKA Neighbourhood was created. We joined the Network of Volunteers. We expanded our help to other provinces in the country (together with AMIA and the JDC). The Community Medicine Bank was created. An Assistance Program for Holocaust Survivors Program is implemented, (with the financial support of the Claims Conference) and projects were developed to ease the consequences of the socioeconomic crisis: women's health, paediatric ckeck-ups. Local fundraising increases by a 90% while at the same time international financial assistance decreases.

2005-2007 - Special Programs and incorporation of beneficiaries to the Community Social Network

Social development programs are put into action in the areas of health, education and housing, which aim to strengthen the abilities of children and young adults, and to improve the living conditions of seniors, also open to beneficiaries from AMIA, Jabad Lubavitch, Sefaradies y Joint. The Center for Job Training for Young adults is created, the High School Contention Program and the co-financing for the NET Program of College Schollarships is incorporated.

2008-2023 – The Foundation began a process of insertion within the argentine society

The positioning of Fundación Tzedaká is consolidated among other national social organizations. The articulated work with other social organizations and with the government was reinforced. New educational programs are created and the distribution of medicines is multiplied through out the country.





Incomes




Fund Allocation
